#### **AA-Class Transfer Update**

#### **By Barrett Brown**

The AA transfer rules have changed for the upcoming 2006 racing season, so this is a good time for an overview of the OMRA AA transfer process.

The AA program is designed to select the best of the best from all classes and have them compete head-tohead. Primarily, the program is intended to promote the health of the sport by encouraging the dominant Amateurs to move into the Expert classes; they'll be more likely to

move up if the Expert classes [including the age classes], are free from the domination of the fastest, few riders overall. Typically the AA program might pull about ten riders (combining the *mandatory* transferred riders, with *volunteer* AA entrants) out of the Expert ranks. In order to continue to encourage new riders

to join us in the greatest sport in

the world, the entry classes need

to be as welcoming -from a



competitive standpoint- as possible, and this is one step in that effort.

For each racing series with a AA transfer rule in place, at each event in that series, the times for all OMRA riders finishing the event will be compared. The fastest six OMRA riders -regardless of class- will earn AA transfer points along the following schedule:

1 <sup>st</sup>	6 points
2 <sup>nd</sup>	5 points
3 <sup>rd</sup>	4 points
<b>4</b> <sup>th</sup>	3 points
5 <sup>th</sup>	2 pints
6 <sup>th</sup>	1 point

At the end of the season, the six riders (with the most AA transfer points) earn the honor of making up the Mandatory AA list for the following year. Additionally, any OMRA member who wins the Overall at any event in the series automatically earns inclusion on the Mandatory AA list for the following year. It's important to note that a *new list* will be generated every year. Riders can be bumped off the list in the same way riders transfer onto the list. This is not a "Once a AA, always a AA." rule. "Volunteers" can move in and out of the AA class during the year, and Mandatory AA class racers can elect to ride Expert after transferring off the Mandatory AA list.

At the discretion of the OMRA board of Referees or the Promoter, riders who have earned AA or Pro status in a racing series from other regions may also be required to ride the AA class at OMRA events.

Finally, the much different Amateur to Expert transfer point program allows -and encourages- appeals to correct unfair transfers (because of low turnout in a racers class during the year, for example). AA transfer points, however, are assigned purely based on demonstrated speed throughout the prior year, regardless of class finish. As such, the Board of Referees will only consider appeals based on extreme circumstances, such as a rider's recent, permanent disability for example.

Here is the "Best Of The Best" - The Mandatory AA Riders List For 2006: Derek Steahly, Dan Fergason, Jeremy Puma, Reid Brown, Garrison Gragg, Alex Gragg Congratulations, Guys, you rock!!

#### **Legal Updates and Action Alerts!**

\* Tillamook State Forest: Oregon Dept. of Forestry is now proposing that the number of 'total' motorized events (including 4WD) is no more than 13 now. This is alarming since this is approximately half of the previous years. ODF has reserved Jan 30 for a meeting to discuss this. We STRONGLY urge you to GET INVOLVED and contact either the Forest Grove or Tillamook ODF offices beforehand and voice your concerns! Here is the text from ODF's message, "This past year it has become increasingly evident that we need to retool the motorized recreation program on the Tillamook State Forest. The biggest indicator of this need is the number of seasonal trail closures we needed to do this winter. Our trail system is not in shape to handle the increased level of motorized recreation it is getting, both organized and non-organized. Trail maintenance should to be our top priority and staff time needs to be adjusted to adequately plan, implement and administer trail maintenance. To free up this needed staff time, we are proposing a number of significant changes to the Motorized Event Program for 2006. These changes include setting a calendar of available dates for events, reducing the total number of events to 13, establishing a simple drawing to allocate those dates and generally being more businesslike in how we administer the program. We have scheduled three meetings related to 2006 Motorized Events." Please don't sit around on this contact them now (below) politely and directly, pointing out how OHV's have been working collaboratively for years in the TSF and that this appears to be a ploy to get motorized recreation out of the forest! Killing events encourages roque use and irresponsible recreation.

Wow, '06 is already here. I'm sitting here thinking of what's ahead for this year. We changed a few rules at our calendar meeting last November. We worked on who needs to be in the AA class. We decided on the top six overall finishers for the year. We also wanted any rider who overalls an event to race AA. If you are fast enough to beat all the AA riders, then you are fast enough to be a AA rider. We also dropped the 250cc class. We have been looking at the results and found that we will not be able to give out

a year-end trophy for the expert 250 class XC. In GP we

will give out one trophy in the 250 expert class and he only rode six races. I remember when the 250 class was one of the biggest. For '06. the 250cc two strokes will run in the open class. For you diehard 250 riders. remember this, when I get lapped by the faster guys (more often than I want to

mention), I have noticed



that some of them are on 250's. It will be a good race between the 250's and the 450's. If you have a 250F (four stroke), then you can run in the 200cc class. That will be a great race between a 250F and a 200KTM. The other rule change is in the sportsman class. We went up to 150cc four strokes. We want to keep this class simple for the beginners. We said the 150cc will have a wheel size of 17 inches or smaller rear, and 19 inch front. If someone wants to spend the money and get a fast 150cc four-stroke bike build by BBR or others, then they can race in the 200 amateur class.

As a referee, I would like to talk about the kind of people I see at an OMRA event - GOOD PEOPLE. I love to see families come out and have a great time. I have been to other types of sport events where the party is the main focus. With OMRA people, the focus is on being responsible and leading by example. Take for example when the race is over and everyone goes home - I do not see a bunch of trash all over the place. Our people pick it up. Since a lot of OMRA people camp out at the racetracks. I get to spend time just hanging out with them. Friendship is what comes to mind.

With the rising cost of gas, we may need to hook up with a buddy and share the expenses. If you are going to drive and camp out with someone, it might as well be a good friend.

'06 will be hard on the clubs. The cost of putting on an event is going up and we need more riders to show up. Everything costs more for the riders also and it's harder to make it to all the races. If you know someone who has been thinking about racing, now is a good time to invite him or her.

Every time I race I think of how good we have it. We have a lot of public land to race on here in Oregon. Other states have a little park and the riders just go around in circles. Remember that we are more then just racers. We are ambassadors for the sport that we love. We need to continue riding responsibly.

If you just like to ride in new or different areas, then a poker run is just right. The clubs put on great runs and they have easy or hard courses. It's not a race and you can go at whatever speed you choose. It's a great way to teach a child how to ride. We offer dualsport rides as well. If your bike is street legal, then you will have a blast. OMRA again this year is offering a race series for the quad riders. Remember the saying, "We will all hang together or we will all hang separately"? OMRA is not just about racing. We

fight to keep our lands open for all to enjoy. It's a simple rule, "All for one or none for all" I think Steve McQueen said it best at the Elsinore grand prix, "Every time I think the world is all bad, then I start to see all the good people just out having fun on motorcycles and it makes me take another look."

Lobos' members have recently made several trips to the East Fort Rock OHV Area to do volunteer work with the COHVOPS team grooming trails in the system. Volunteer hours are matched with grant funds from your ATV Fund. This fund is funded with gasoline taxes allocated from fuel purchased for use in ORVs. The drags are pulled between 5-7mph, so there's time to enjoy the scenery in a way that isn't possible at speed and I would recommend it as an enjoyable way to volunteer for anyone interested in giving back a little to the system. The crew normally grooms Monday through Wednesday and on weekends with special arrangements. When snow settles in at East Fort Rock, operations move north to Millican and Four Corners. Volunteers must be certified to operate the quads that the COHVOPS provides. COHVOPS has provided this certification training in the past, but recognizes anyone trained through the ATV Safety Institute Program. The staff that maintains the EFR and Millican trails are all friendly and most are also motorcycle riders, so they're fun to work with. 
