Interview with Billy Toman

The first time I met Billy Toman was the first time I entered the classic China Hat ISDE race, just East of Bend, Oregon in 1982. This was Billy's event and, in its time, the China Hat ISDE was the biggest off-road event in Oregon. It was THE event to ride every year. Over the years I've had the pleasure of sharing many motorcycling experiences with Billy. He has plenty of knowledgeable advice and is always willing to help in times of need. The man always keeps a finger on the pulse of our favorite sport and continues even into retirement. He loves motorcycling, always smiles, speaks well in public gatherings, is an accomplished rider, has been the AMA off-road rep in Oregon for years, has been an OMRA officer many times and was instrumental in creating the organization, is politically active for our issues in the NW, and always has a great time. He is the organizer of the Lobos M/C in Oregon City, Oregon and has ridden in many parts of the country. Here's a little insight into this celebrity, who many people owe thanks to, but may or may not know it:

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
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Q: Tell us about yourself: Who is Billy Toman?

Billy: I'm 69 yrs old and in good health. I'm not sure if my health is because I ride, or that I ride because I am in good health. One would think that at my age I would get smart enough to try something else for a hobby. I'm sure there are those that would like me to try something else, but I plan to out live those that have that attitude. My age is somewhat a help when dealing with the various land managers, for they do give us old guys a little respect and forgiveness when we say the wrong things.

Q: How long have you been riding and what got you started?

Billy: I have been riding since 1953 when in the Air force I was introduced to the first BSA to hit the US. The pilots that flew to England would pick up a bike and load it into the bombers and bring it to El Paso. I was the bike mechanic on the base so I got to ride their bikes when the pilots had to go



on flying missions, My first two bikes were Harleys with foot clutch and hand shifts, then I was able to buy my first 500cc BSA single in 1957. I now ride a lot of dualsport bikes and they have made great strides since the good old days. I will soon have a new 2001 DRZ400 Suzuki and so hope to have a few more years left in the old body to continue laying out fun events for those that like to ride. Q: Where are your favorite places to ride? Billy: My favorite places to ride is

where the rocks are

small and the dirt is

firm, but I do like both the Tillamook area and The Bend/China Hat area, I have rode great events in Washington and Northern California and those are really nice also.

Q: What happened to your legacy, the China Hat ISDE and what plans do you have for it now?

Billy: The China-Hat ISDE type event (that the Lobos hosted for 17 yrs)



came to an end from the lack of club members that it takes to run those types of events. The bottom line is that if riders want those type events, you have to join a club of your choice and be more then just a rider - be part of the action also. There are great rewards in laying out events and the pride you get when the event goes well.

Q: You're active in dualsporting, racing, etc., [He co hosts the Billy-Bob Dualsport ride] so what are your plans and why should

people ride your events?

Billy: The reasons for my directions towards dualsporting is that it opens a lot more areas and trails that the average off-road bike cannot get to, and the land managers like the dualsport bikes because they are generally quieter and less aggressive tires, so the trails get less impact. In riding the dualsport events like the Black Dog, it takes you into areas that you would normally never see, and in the case of China-hat, we take you into areas like the Big Hole, Crack In The Ground and so on, that you would never see. I will say that in most of the years of riding, if you're not having fun, try something else or a different aspect of the sport. Motocross is great for the young, but cross-country is the next step to try, or the ISDE types of events are a kick.

Q: What is the funniest thing or story that's happened regarding your motorcycling endeavors?

Billy: In the days of mass starts in the Millican valley I was there with a few of my fellow Lobo desert racers, We always tried to make the sport fun rather than taking the whole thing too seriously. As we are waiting for the famous smoke bomb that Larry Ulrich and Cascade MC club would use, and a dead engine start, my buddy Chuck Isaackson, who was sitting next to my left and always a jokester, was making fun of a rider down the line who fell over, bike and all. Unknown to me, while he's pointing to the flustered rider and I'm trying to see the action, Chuckie was pulling my plug wire off. now the flags just drops and Chuck and most of the line takes off like a herd of buffalo. Im kicking and kicking my IT 400 but no life, so I think quick plug change time----- and now I spot the famous plug trick. So knowing that no way am I going to catch the herd by now I took a few more moments out of my time and went back to the pits and deplugged two plugs of eight in Chuckie's truck. The next meeting he went into great details how he just barely got over Mt. Hood cause his sled was running kinda sick and had a garage tune up his truck. During the meeting he tells all how he fixed Billy at the line, and when the laughter dies dow n, I handed Chuck a beer and told the boy's why not to mess with the Ole Billy. I'll sure miss ole Chuck

Q: How does your wife, Dora, put up with you?

Billy: I have to give many thanks to my wife Dorie-Belle [The name "Dorie-Belle" is an inside joke that you'll have to ask Billy about!]. She has helped me in many events and seems to know all you riders by name, your moms and kids etc. (Where I have trouble with your first names a lot of the time – a blessing of old age). I go by the belief that God created motorcycles on the seventh day, so we would have something to do after church! [Gotta love those final words of wisdom! So if you ever happen to have the chance to meet Billy, be sure and shake his hand, thank him for continuing to promote the sport and admire the vigor that he possesses with the enjoyment of two-wheeled adventure. I (and many others) can only hope that I still have the same outlook and energy when I reach his age.]

The Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD) today announced agreements with the ATV Safety Institute (ASI) and the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) to provide safety training for all-terrain and off-highway vehicle operators throughout Oregon. ASI will provide a hands-on, half-day All-Terrain Vehicle (ATV) "RiderCourse" designed to help Class 1 ATV operators increase their safety awareness and practice basic riding skills in controlled environments supervised by licensed instructors. The course also stresses the environmentally responsible use of ATVs. "Our goal is to provide ATV riders in this state with the highest quality, most

comprehensive training available," said Terry Eccles, OPRD's ATV Program Coordinator. "The ATV Safety Institute has trained over 425,000 ATV riders across the country in the past 13 years. By working together, we intend to

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develop a statew ide program that is second to none." Purchasers of new ATVs may be eligible for free training. Others, including children age six and over, may take the course for a small fee. Family participation is encouraged. Individuals interested in enrolling should call 800-887-2887 to be scheduled for a "RiderCourse" class in their local area. ASI has 39 licensed instructors teaching at 26 locations across the state. MSF's "DirtBike School" also offers a hands-on, half-day course focusing on basic riding techniques and the environmentally responsible use of offhighway (Class III ATV) motorcycles. Lessons are presented in a controlled riding area free of ruts. rocks and other obstacles, and feature such skills as riding in sharp circles, making quick and sharp turns, and riding on hills. Individuals should call 877-288-7093 to enroll in a "DirtBike School" class in their local area. Family and group classes are available. Participants may use their own vehicles in either the ATV or motorcycle training. The use of loaned vehicles must be arranged in advance. July 9 - 12, 2001

This is a "heads up" that an Off-highway Vehicle Planning and Management Workshop is being planned for July 9th to July 12th, 2001 (Monday through Thursday). The workshop is an inter-agency effort, sponsored by the USDA Forest Service, USDI Bureau of Land Management, Oregon State Parks and Recreation, and the National Off-Highway Vehicle Conservation Council. The cadre of speakers will consist of some of the most experienced OHV managers in the Nation. In addition, this workshop will be an ideal time for land managers and OHV enthusiasts to discuss issues in a relaxed manner. The objectives of the sessions are to: develop strong working relationships between enthusiasts and land managers; better understand OHV recreation needs; learn about successful planning and management strategies for meeting those needs; become better acquainted with research information available to aid in analyzing and mitigating impacts; develop OHV and travel management expertise; demonstrate how to mobilize and use OHV volunteers to perform trail projects; and to experience projects for maintenance and construction of motorized trails. The workshop agenda will be designed for a combined audience of Line Managers, Field Specialists, and OHV Enthusiasts. Monday is an optional day, set aside for ATV Certification Training. Wednesday will involve a field trip and hands on training for specific management techniques. Tuesday and Thursday are targeted toward Field Personnel and OHV Enthusiasts with discussions on management concepts, NEPA process, OHV issues and general principles.

Jeff Zertana Injured

On 4/26, one of Oregon's most gifted and up-and-coming offroad riders, Jeff Zertana, was injured at Portland International Raceway during an MX race. I don't know much about the details, but what I've heard thus far is that Jeff went over a jump, flew about 30' and somehow separated from, then landed on his bike. He has since been in extreme critical condition. His leg is broken, lungs are damaged, and has swelling of the brain. The hospital has induced a comma to hopefully reduce the brain swelling. I just got this update on 5/1:

Tom: Jeff is still critical and the hospital will be doing tests on him tonight. What test I have no idea. Jeff did move his head tonight when they tried to feed him. (Guess he didn't like the green stuff) He is in a comma and the brain swelling has gone done. He still needs help breathing with the machine. When I know more I will let you know.

Since last week, it appears that Jeff is improving, albeit on a small scale. That is about all I know at this time and will let you all know more as I hear it. Please include Jeff and his family in your prayers for this most unfortunate incident. **Subsequent Update**: "Jeff's condition remains critical with small improvements. He had three operations yesterday and still needs one more. The last one is to remove a small section of his lung. The Doctors feel that Jeff will make it but they don't know of what degree of brain damage he has. They won't know that until Jeff comes out of the coma which they are guessing will be a couple of more weeks. Jeff will remain in ICU for at least two to three more weeks. Other than the brain and lung damage all of Jeff other organs are doing well."
